Thought for the Week

On Sunday 6th June our Bible reading was taken from the Gospel of Mark, Chapter 3: 20-35 where Jesus says "Anybody who does God's will is my brother! And my sister! And my mother!"

At our Connect Service we talked about our own families, and shared the words we would use to describe what family means to us: everything, unconditional love, connection, comfort, safety, home, known, identity, acceptance, loyalty, bond, commitment, belonging, love, complicated & disappointing.

We must nearly all come from great families, because the words we used to describe our families were very positive overall, but we know that isn't the experience of family that everyone has! Our own families are places that are important to us, although not always what we hoped for.

In this Gospel story we have a revelation of what family means for Jesus. The crowd, according to the norms of the time, thought of family as the chief place where you would experience belonging and identify, but Jesus finds it primarily in the intimacy or union that God wants and offers to all of us. That is where we will find family. With the Trinity, as we looked at with Rev. Dan on Trinity Sunday. The Trinity are a family of the Father, Son & Holy Spirit who model love and intimacy in relationship to one another. Many people are searching for those things that family offer; identity, belonging, a home, unconditional love. We will only truly find those things, when we come into the family of God and welcome others in as well.

Jesus always made a point of finding out and becoming friends with the most socially unacceptable and often highly unlikeable characters, whether that's tax collectors or prostitutes and he did this by seeking them, getting to know them, identifying with them and welcoming them to his family.

As the St James family, we are called to welcome strangers into our family and all the more reason now, after this very difficult time of being isolated from each other. Perhaps blessing someone you live near or eating with people, sharing life and conversation around the table and praying for strangers to become neighbours. There's no wrong way to do this, it starts simply with noticing and listening to people around you. Have fun!
